


Year 6 Easter Holiday Revision



As you know, many of you have been doing a lot of hard work this half term in preparation for your tests after Easter. It would be barmy to let all that effort go to waste now -wouldn't it? So, just to keep you ticking along, we have set you some tasks for the holidays.

These will help prepare you for all of the SATs tests you'll be taking in May (9th – 12th).

It is **your responsibility** to think about what you need to work on and spend some extra time on that. You need to spend more time on the things that you find difficult (even though it might be fun to spend time on 'Cool Maths' games, it's not effective use of your time if you are already very good at maths). Doing a little of this work every day is the best way to revise and will also leave you with plenty of time to relax and enjoy yourself which is also important.

We have included a list of websites which will help you. You should also find these enjoyable! If you don't have access to the Internet at home, then your local library should be able to provide this service free of charge, or maybe you could revise with a friend?

'Tutortastic' Easter Revision booklet – do one task per day (there are 10 tasks so you'll be able to have a few days off!). Each task should take roughly 10 minutes but if you need longer to complete it, that's fine. Once you have completed a task, use the Answers booklet to mark it (be honest!). Record your score on the score sheet.

'10 Minute Reading Tests' – do one task every other day (there are 6 tasks so, again, you'll be able to have some time off!). Each task should take roughly 10 minutes but if you need longer to complete it, that's fine. Once you've completed a task, use the answers to mark it. If there are answers you're unsure about, why not ask an older sibling / parent to help you? Record your score on the score sheet.

'New Curriculum Spelling Lists' – these are words that you should be able to spell. Try to learn / practise a few each day. Make sure you know what they mean and how to use them in sentences.

Lots of these sites are linked to the old curriculum but will still be useful.
When you're searching for resources, try to include 'KS2 SATS 2016' in your search.
