Updates

The Year 3 children have enjoyed the start of their 'Stone Age' topic, learning about food and homes and are looking forward to their visit from Celtic Harmony on Tuesday, 22nd November. This will be a really exciting, practical day, filled with lots of hands-on activities. In Science, the children have been studying 'Animals including humans', learning about vertebrates and invertebrates, human bones and muscles. Why not ask your child to tell you an interesting fact about the human body?

The Year 4 Geography topic about France culminated in a 'French Café' being set up in the hall. Each class visited the café in turn and had the opportunity to practise their French speaking and listening skills, by ordering a croissant or pain au chocolat and either an orange juice or chocolate milk. Some children acted as waiters and waitresses, taking orders and bringing out the food and drinks. We have now started a History topic about the Ancient Egyptians. The children have carried out some research of their own for homework and next week we will have an exciting visit from Crew Theatre.

Year 5 have really enjoyed reading 'How to Train Your Dragon' by Cressida Cowell and have produced some great pieces of writing. A piece of writing by Ananya in 5K was published on Twitter and we received a message back from Cressida Cowell herself which the children were very excited about! In history, we have started finding out about the Vikings, where they came from and why, when and how they arrived in Britain.

Rehearsals for this term's Year 6 production of 'The Amazing Adventures of Superstan' started this week—there's a lot of work ahead but it's set to be a fun-filled performance! Back in the classroom, we're loving 'The Falcon's Malteser' and have also had a tweet from the author, Anthony Horowitz. The children seem to have really captured his style in some of their writing; keep an eye on Twitter as there might be some examples of work shared on their over the next week or so. Having finished our Geography topic of 'Rivers', we're now looking forward to learning all about World War 2 in history whilst in Maths, we've been tackling some pretty complicated skills linked to 2d and 3d shapes.

Packham Tournament

On Saturday, 5th November, two Oak Farm teams took part in the annual Packham 6 a-side football tournament at Abbotsfield. In their group, our 'B' team came up against the 'A' teams from three other schools. The team played really well, picking up a draw in their opening game and narrowly losing another game 3-2, despite two excellent goals from Corey.

While the 'B' team hadn't quite done enough to get through their group, our 'A' team started superbly, putting 5 goals past St. Matthew's 'B' in their first match, including a hat-trick by Shae and a first goal for the school by Levi. A draw against Hillingdon was followed by a 6-0 victory against Highfield 'B' in the final group game.

Having progressed to the quarter-finals as group winners, we came through a tight encounter against Cherry Lane, winning 1-0. In the semi-final, the team played magnificently, brushing aside St. Bernadette 3-0 to make the final.



The final was a very evenly-contested match, with both sides creating opportunities to win. However, no goals were scored in normal time, meaning the game went to extra-time. Unfortunately for us, St. Matthew's scored a cracking goal in the extra period to finally run out 1-0 winners.

Both of our teams represented the school extremely well and should be very proud of their achievements.

Girls' Tournament

On Wednesday, 9th November, two girls' teams represented Oak Farm in the Uxbridge and District Girls' tournament at the Hillingdon Leisure Complex. Both of our teams, made up of children from years 4, 5 and 6, played really well and thoroughly enjoyed the competition.

Our 'B' team made a great start, beating St. Helen's 'B' in their first game, before suffering two narrow defeats. Our 'A' team, meanwhile, had a very tough opening match, losing 1-0 to a very strong team from Highfield. However, they bounced back to record a 1-0 victory against Hillingdon 'B', before a convincing 3-0 win against St. Bernadette 'C', with Sienna scoring a magnificent hat-trick. Unfortunately, it wasn't quite enough to get through to the semi-finals, with the Oak Farm team narrowly missing out on goals scored.




Congratulations to all of the girls for the excellent performance and attitude throughout the competition. They were all great ambassadors for our school.
